Dr. Aubrey Morrison will provide a one-hour, face-to-face presentation on responsible conduct of research (RCR) related to research misconduct. Topics that will be discussed include: what constitutes research misconduct, Washington University policies, and potential land mines based on examples from our University and others.

### RCR Training Requirements

This one-hour event will help fulfill the RCR requirement for both NSF and applicable NIH awards.

- **NIH** - Undergraduates, graduate students, and postdocs on NIH training grants, career awards, or fellowships are required to receive 8 hours of RCR education.
- **NSF** - Undergraduates, graduate students, and postdocs on any NSF award are required to receive 1 hour of face-to-face education per year (in addition to one-time completion of the online PERCSS curriculum).
