



Call for Applications: Doris Duke Fund to Retain Clinical Scientists Program

Letters of Intent and Applications Due: April 1st, 2020

The Doris Duke Fund to Retain Clinical Scientists Program (DDFRCS) has been developed to provide innovative institutional solutions to reduce faculty attrition by assisting junior faculty facing extraprofessional demands. The DDRCS provides broad-based education to raise awareness and implement new interventions, as well as resources and mentoring to support junior faculty facing extraprofessional challenges.

PROGRAM BENEFITS

- One-year grants of \$30,000 - \$50,000 (with the possibility of a second year) to fund a wide variety of assistance including technical or administrative support, or up to 25% salary support for PI
- Two program mentors appointed for career development advice and sponsorship
- Annual meetings with current scholars, alumni and senior faculty to foster relationships and ongoing networking
- Programs focused on career development

APPLICANT ELIGIBILITY

- WashU Physician Scientists (MD, DO, or MD/PhD degree) at the Instructor or Assistant Professor level
- PI on a NIH, federal agency or foundation-sponsored grant
- Rationale for how funds will help maintain scientific productivity in the face of extraprofessional personal demands
