



K12 Mentored Training in Implementation Science (MTIS) Program *Call for Applications!*

MTIS prepares scholars to become independent, productive Dissemination and Implementation (D&I) researchers focused on Heart, Lung, Blood, and Sleep (HLBS) disorders. This K12 program provides personalized educational pathways that allow scholars to identify competencies needed to address their specific goals and anticipated career trajectory.

Program Requirements

- Doctoral Degree (e.g. MD, PhD, PharmD, EdD, ScD, DPT, and OTD)
- US citizen, non-citizen national, or permanent resident
- Minimum 75% effort
- Within 5 years of postdoctoral or fellowship training
- A research and career development plan focused on D&I research in HLBS disorders supported by at least 1 mentor approved by the program
- Faculty appointment (Must have by start of program)

Scholar Benefits

- 75% of the scholar's salary (up to \$100K per year)
- \$30K per year to support research, tuition & travel
- Career Advisory Committee
