



Cancer Biology Pathway Program Call for Pre- & Postdoctoral Applications Deadline: June 10, 2019

The Cancer Biology Pathway provides comprehensive training for those embarking on a career in cancer research to tackle and solve problems that cause significant morbidity and mortality in our country.

Accepted trainees will receive:

- Stipend support for 2 years
- Didactic coursework
- Journal clubs
- An annual retreat
- Clinical shadowing opportunities
- Access to a Bioinformatics boot camp
- Imaging and drug discovery seminars
- Grant writing workshop

Eligibility

All trainees must:

- Be working with a mentor who is a current Siteman Cancer Center member
- Have the ability to participate in the program for 2 years, starting September 1
- May not be simultaneously supported by an NIH or other federal grant during the program

Predoctoral trainees must be:

- A PhD student from any Program in the Division of Biology and Biomedical Sciences;
- Entering their 2nd and 3rd years of graduate training;

Postdoctoral trainees must be:

- Within two years of receiving their PhD at the time of application
- A US citizen or permanent resident
