2019 Cycle 2 - Request for Applications (RFA)

Purpose:

The Siteman Investment Program (SIP) funds internal, cancer-related research projects twice a year. This funding opportunity is designed to support projects which involve clinical trials, correlative studies on otherwise funded clinical trials, or which generate preliminary data that will provide the basis for future NIH or other nationally competitive funding. 2019 Cycle 2 Updates:

To ensure all requirements are met, please review the 2019 Cycle 2 RFA thoroughly. Significant updates this cycle include (but are not limited to):

- Updated SIP Application Cover Sheet
- Team Science applicants are now required to have an established Internal Advisory Board that has met at least once prior to the Statement of Intent submission. In addition, Team Science applicants are required to present all planned projects to SCC's Senior Leadership Committee prior to submitting the Statement of Intent due September 3rd.

Mechanisms:

- CLINICAL TRIAL CATEGORY
 - New Clinical Trial Mechanism; **up to \$300,000* over 3 years**
 - Established Clinical Trial Mechanism; **up to \$200,000* over 2 years**
- PRE-R01 CATEGORY
 - Pre-R01 Mechanism; **up to \$200,000* over 2 years**
 - Pre-R01 Mechanism with a Cancer Prevention & Control Emphasis; **up to \$200,000* over 2 years**
 - Multi-PI Pre-R01 Mechanism; **up to \$400,000* over 2 years**
- TEAM SCIENCE CATEGORY
 - Team Science Mechanism; **up to \$800,000* over 2 years**

*please note: although applicants may request up to the full amount, there is no minimum amount required

2019 SIP Cycle 2 Deadlines:

Statement of Intent: September 3, 2019 by 4:00pm CST
Full Application: October 1, 2019 by 4:00pm CST
Decision Notification: December 15, 2019
Award Start Date: January 1, 2020
